


#### The Fork in the Road: Distinguishing Wheat from Tares

How do we distinguish the true church from the false?

#### Why are you so uncomfortable with leadership?

- True spiritual leadership is a burden undertaken out of obedience, not personal ambition or comfort. It is about steering people toward their destiny, often in a hidden way.
- The primary mission is to prepare the way for the Lord by preparing His people for Him. Drawing attention to oneself is a failure of this mission.

## The Gift of Inadequacy

Feeling inadequate is a spiritual asset, not a liability. It is the very condition that forces a leader to constantly lean on and trust in God's strength rather than their own.

Accepting inadequacy is essential; starting to feel adequate is when a leader becomes dangerous. No person is capable of their calling without God's help.



### "The Vision of the King"

Core Concept: An encounter with the glory of God ('the King') is the ultimate humbling experience. It eradicates the fear of man and destroys self-importance. In His presence, all other status and power become insignificant.


Key Quote: "I have seen the King, and it's hard to be impressed by anyone when you have seen Him... In the presence of the Lamb even the twenty-four elders cast their crowns at His feet. Who could presume to be worthy of glory or attention in His presence?"



## Seeing with an Unveiled Face

The purpose of the path is to strip away our internal 'veils'—our facades, pretenses, and selfish ambitions. Only with an unveiled face can we see God's glory clearly and be transformed into His image. Seeing Him with veils on results in a distorted view.

This path will humble us all. If you stay on this path your veils, facades, pretenses, and selfish ambition will be removed. Then we can see His glory. When we see His glory with an unveiled face, we will be changed into His same image.



#### THE MANIFEST PRESENCE: A CONSUMING FIRE

Being in God's manifest presence is the deepest yearning of the human heart, an experience nothing on earth can satisfy.

This encounter can range from a subtle gentleness to an overwhelming intensity, like a "nuclear fire."

This fire is not anger but holiness—a purifying force that is both painful and wonderful beyond description. It "hurts good."


# THE GREATEST PRIZE OF THE JOURNEY
