Judgment is not Condemnation, but Liberation.

- The experience at the judgment seat strips the soul bare, removing all pretense and the compulsion to hide.
- Initial terror gives way to profound liberation and peace.
- This complete transparency is the casting off of the heaviest spiritual burdens.

Having nothing to hide was like casting off the heaviest yoke and the strongest shackles. I began to feel as if I could breathe like I had never breathed before.

The Lord appears as **Wisdom**, more glorious than ever before.

Righteous judgment is not about condemning or justifying, but about bringing all things into **unity with God**.

His **divine justice** transcends human conflicts, seeking to save even the **enemies** of His people.

—When I come, it is to take over—not to take sides.—

Anointing Without Humility Leads to Deception.



- Supernatural gifts are tokens of the age to come, but they carry great danger.
- The greatest deception for the anointed is to believe your thoughts are God's thoughts.
- True humility is not false modesty; it's recognizing your own "blindness" and utter dependence on Him.

"That is why I said, 'Who is blind but My servant?'... If you were blind you would not be guilty, but because you claim to see, your guilt remains."

To Have His Judgment, You Must Have His Heart.



- Knowing God's mind provides supernatural knowledge.
- Knowing God's ways provides purpose and direction.
- But only knowing God's **heart** allows one to use that knowledge and purpose righteously.

My Life and Ministry are Not the Example; Jesus Alone is That.

From his great throne, the Apostle Paul confesses he fell short of his calling.

He warns against using his letters as a *foundation* instead of building upon the one true **foundation: the words and life of Jesus.**

True humility is agreeing with the truth; Paul admits he was the “**greatest of sinners**” not out of false modesty, but as a sober assessment.



Recovering the Message and the Ministry

- **The Ministry:** Was once the greatest sacrifice, reflecting the message of the cross.



- **The Message:** Must be centered on the cross, which is the true power of God.

You now have so little power to transform the minds and hearts of believers because you do not live or preach the cross.

"Every Floor Built Upon the Foundation Should Go Higher."



- “The goal is not to be like Paul, but to be like the Lord.”
- “The last-day church is called to do greater works, not through its own merit, but because more grace is available.”
- “The ‘great cloud of witnesses’ from the past cheers for the current generation to go further than they did.”

The Greatest Overcomers are Often Invisible to the World.



- Meet Angelo: A deaf, abused, homeless man who was given only three portions of God's love.
- He used all he was given to overcome rage, to stop stealing, and to share the gospel with the one person who would listen.
- His small acts of faithfulness in the face of immense suffering made him one of the great kings in heaven.

“He Overcame the World with My Love.”



Angelo was a martyr every day he lived, **dying to himself for the sake of others.**

His final act: **He froze to death while using his own body to keep another homeless man alive.**

His story reveals that God's judgment is not based on outward success, but on the love that motivates our actions.

“He would rejoice more over an apple than some of My people do over a great feast.”



If They Would Have Taken Him In, They Would Have Taken Me In.

The narrator confesses he once mocked Angelo on the street, calling him a “religious nut.” The church missed receiving one of God's greatest servants because they judged by appearances.

Compassion, guided by the Spirit, is the key that removes the veils from our souls and allows us to see as God sees.

Your Confidence Must Not Be In Yourself, But In Him.

Losing confidence in yourself is the prerequisite for being trusted with God's true power.

This void must be filled with faith and confidence in Christ, not with insecurity or false humility.

The Lord's final prayer is for His people to be filled with the Father's perfect love, which casts out all fear.



I say again, ‘Let there be My Father’s love in you.’

Love is the Greatest Weapon.



God gives power so His people can better express His love. Love, not miraculous power, is the ultimate goal of the Christian life. Love is the banner over God's army and the force that will ultimately destroy the works of the enemy.

The Journey Forward is a Journey Inward.



- The final instruction is to not look back, as the experiences of judgment and glory are now internalized.
- The judgment seat, the Garden, the treasures of salvation—they are all now within your heart.
- To walk in wisdom is to see with the eyes of the heart, continually abiding in His presence.
