The Fruit of His Presence

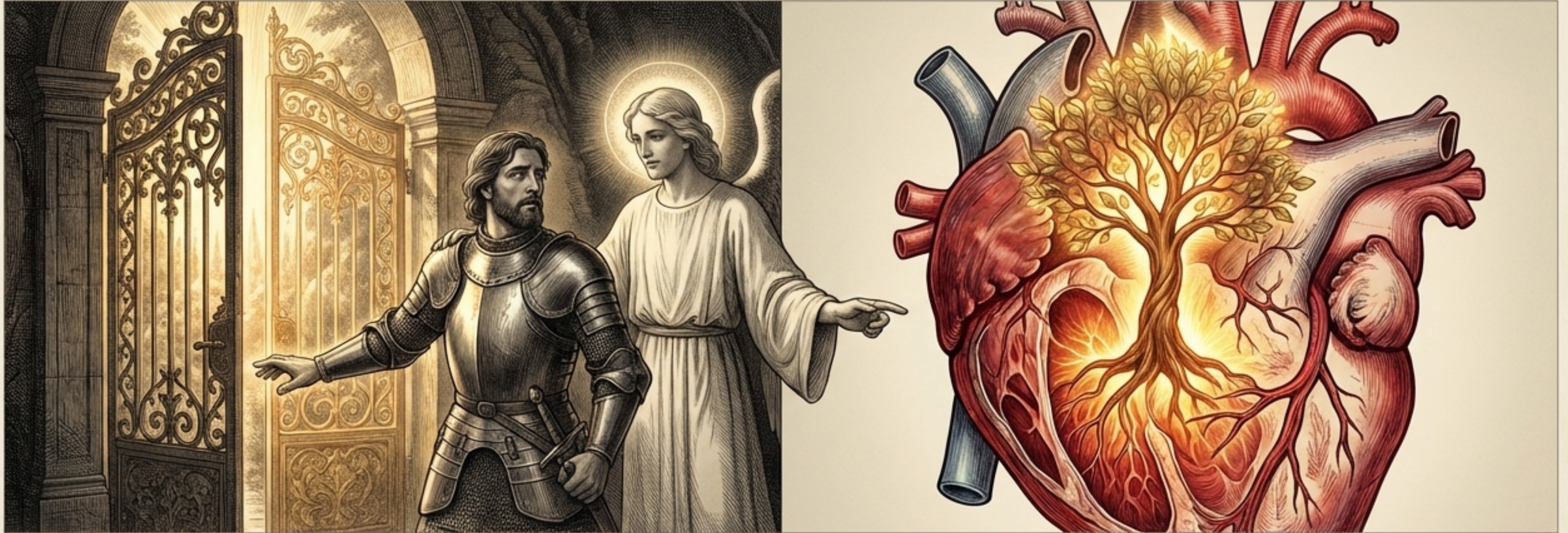


The Glory of Worship

A Garden in the Heart

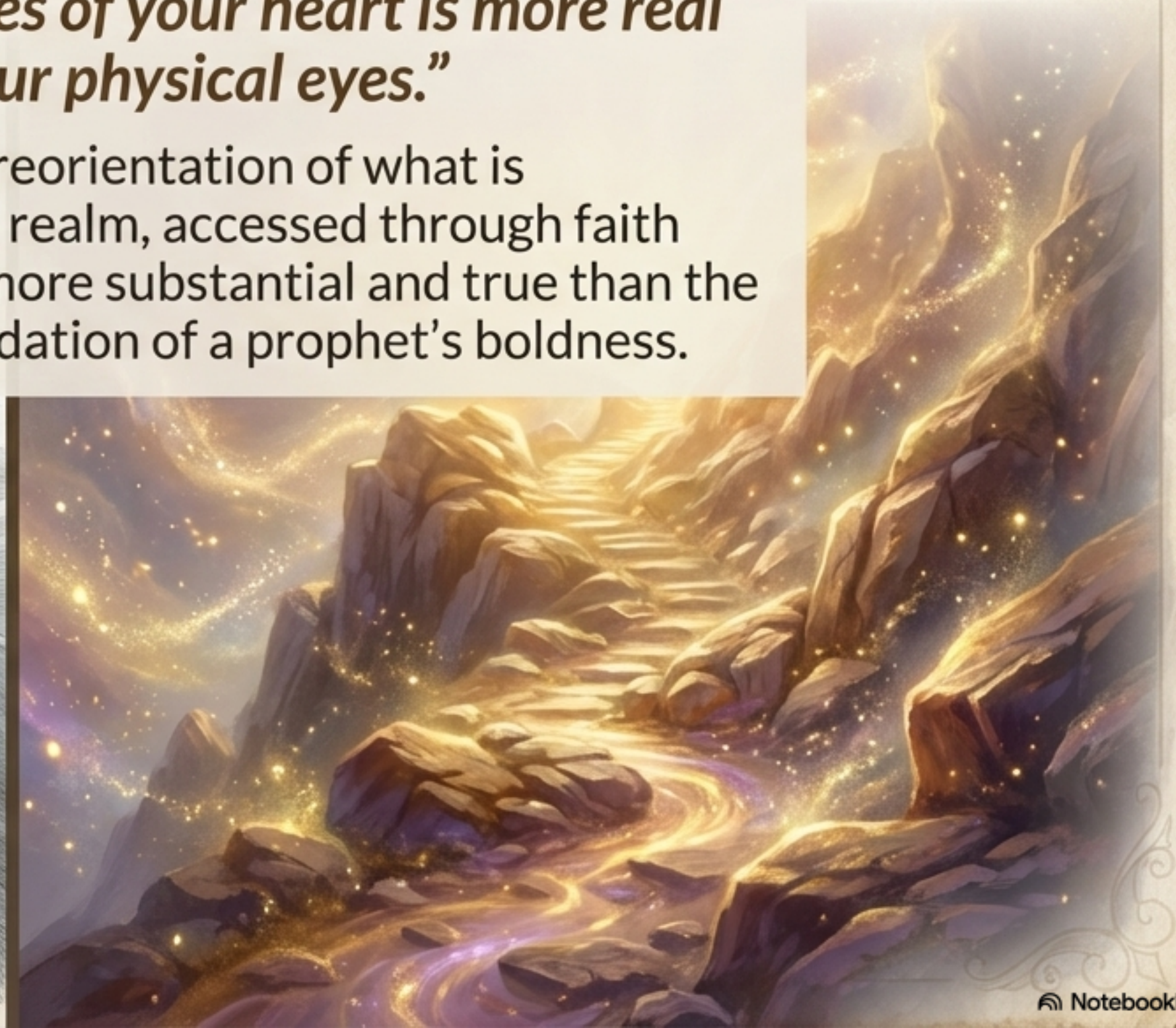
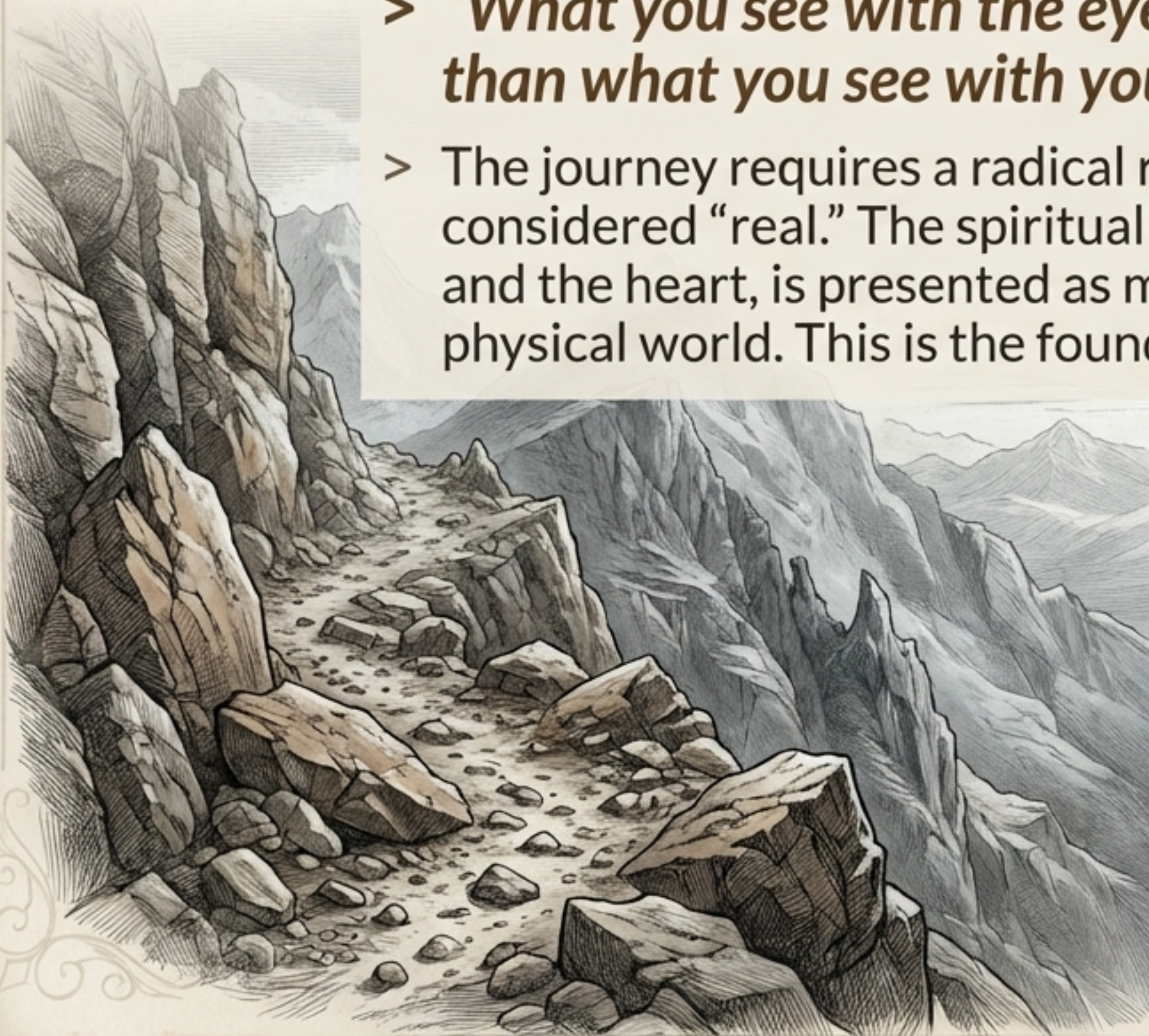


➤ “You never have to leave this Garden,” he assured me. “This Garden is in your heart because the Creator Himself is within you. You must believe.”

The experience of God’s presence is not a temporary location but an internal, accessible state through the indwelling of the Spirit. The journey back to the battle is not a departure from heaven, but a mission to carry it into the world.

The Two Realities

- > *“What you see with the eyes of your heart is more real than what you see with your physical eyes.”*
- > The journey requires a radical reorientation of what is considered “real.” The spiritual realm, accessed through faith and the heart, is presented as more substantial and true than the physical world. This is the foundation of a prophet’s boldness.





The Lion and the Lamb

> “He is both a Lion and a Lamb. To the spiritual children, He is the Lamb. To the maturing, He is the Lion. To the fully mature, He is both...”


Spiritual maturity involves reconciling the dual nature of God: His tender mercy (the Lamb) and His awesome judgment and power (the Lion). True wisdom is knowing when to approach Him in adoration and when to approach Him in reverent fear.

Descending with Purpose

> “I watched as many soldiers who had been to the top began descending... each level began to shine with the glory they carried.” Lato

The purpose of reaching the peak is not to remain there, but to bring the light and glory of that experience down to every level of the battle, relieving and encouraging those who have held their ground. Lato

The Unseen Heroes

> A humbling re-evaluation of spiritual honor. The soldiers on the foundational level —though wounded and less "advanced"—are revealed to be great heroes who made the ascent possible for others by engaging the enemy and saving the lost.

The Hidden Ambush

➤ “That is Pride. It is the hardest enemy to see after you have been in the glory.”

A stark warning. The greatest danger, especially after a great spiritual victory or revelation, is the unseen enemy of Pride. It attacks from the rear, exploiting the vulnerability that comes from a lack of humility and self-awareness.



The Great Defeat

> “I was astounded at how this great company of the righteous had been so easily defeated, and they still did not even know what had hit them.”

Pride’s attack doesn’t kill; it weakens and blinds. Struck by pride, the warriors discard their spiritual armor and weapons, declaring they no longer need them. This makes them susceptible to “Strong Delusion,” leading them into captivity.



The Armor of Humility

> “He then gave me a very plain mantle to put on. ‘What is this?’ I inquired... ‘Humility,’ said Wisdom. ‘You will not be able to see very well without it.’”

The antidote and defense against pride is not more strength or glory, but the simple, plain mantle of humility. It is a covering that allows one to see the hidden dangers of the spiritual world and protects from pride’s attacks by nullifying its power.



The Highest Rank in the Kingdom

➤ An angel replied, **“Because of the mantle. That is the highest rank in the kingdom.”** When questioned, the angel insists, **“No! You are clothed in the grace of God. There is no greater power than that!”**



The great paradox of the Kingdom: true power and authority do not come from visible glory or achievement, but from being clothed in humility, which is the very grace of God. This mantle is recognized by all in heaven and hell as the ultimate power.

The Great Revelation

➤ **“I am with all who go forth to do the will of My Father...” “You’re the Lord!” I cried. “Yes,” He answered. “I told you that I would never leave you or forsake you... you have needed wisdom.”**



The final, beautiful revelation. The guide, the teacher, the angel named Wisdom, was Christ Himself all along. He fulfills His promise to His promise to be with His followers and to manifest as whatever they need for the journey—in this case, wisdom.


